



SKY SEEKS UP TO €1.9 BN IN SERIE A DISPUTE

Sky has reportedly filed a claim seeking up to €1.9 billion in damages from TIM and DAZN over their 2021 Serie A distribution agreement in Italy. The broadcaster alleges the deal caused significant commercial losses after DAZN secured exclusive Serie A rights and partnered with TIM for



distribution. Italy's competition regulator had earlier ruled that the agreement restricted market competition and imposed penalties on both companies. Hearings in the case are expected later this year.

TELESTE IMPROVES MARGINS DESPITE FLAT REVENUE

Finnish technology company Teleste reported stronger profitability



in Q1 2026 even as revenue remained unchanged at €32.2 million. Adjusted EBITDA rose 12.8% to €3.1 million, supported by improved margins, operational discipline and favourable business mix. The company maintained its full-year outlook and said investments in North America and core network operations continue despite ongoing geopolitical and currency-related uncertainties.

CABLEMÓVIL EXPANDS TV OFFER FOR SPANISH OPERATORS

CableMóvil, part of MasOrange, has added the Vuela TV platform to its portfolio for local cable operators in Spain. The service offers more than 90 linear channels and over 50,000 on-demand titles without requiring a set-top box. The package also includes sports content such as LALIGA HYPERMOTION TV



and Primera Federación football coverage, aimed at strengthening local cable operators' entertainment offerings.

HBO MAX GLOBAL EXPANSION LIFTS WBD STREAMING GROWTH

Warner Bros. Discovery said HBO Max has crossed 140 million global subscribers as international expansion continues to drive streaming growth. The company



reported a 7% rise in streaming revenue to \$2.89 billion in Q1 2026, supported by launches in markets including the UK, Germany, Italy and Ireland. Advertising revenue from ad-supported streaming tiers also rose sharply, even as WBD's traditional linear television business continued to decline.

HUAWEI SUES RTL OVER STREAMING PATENT DISPUTE

Huawei has filed a patent infringement case against RTL Group at the Unified Patent Court in Mannheim over MPEG-DASH streaming technology used in video delivery systems. The dispute relates to a European patent covering methods aimed at improving streaming efficiency and reducing buffering. The legal action comes



amid rising patent battles in the streaming sector, with several technology licensors increasingly targeting major OTT platforms and broadcasters over video codec and streaming technologies. ■
